Handover of Facility Dog Activities at Shizuoka Children's Hospital

The retirement of Team Yogi after 9 years of service at Shizuoka Children's Hospital, and the appointment of his successor, Team Ty, will be broadcast on September 6, 2021 via YouTube Live.

Shine On Kids (President: Kimberly Forsythe, <u>http://sokids.org/</u>), a certified non-profit organization that supports children with cancer and other serious illnesses, is pleased to announce that a new team will take over the Hospital Facility Dog Program at Shizuoka Children's Hospital (<u>http://www.shizuoka-pho.jp/kodomo/</u>) starting on September 6, 2021.

Shine On! Kids' Facility Dog Program is an animal-assisted intervention program supporting hospitalized children and their families by pairing a "Hospital Facility Dog," a dog that has received specialized training to work in a hospital, with a nurse or other medical professional who has completed training to become a "Handler," a professional who handles Facility Dogs.

1. Introducing the new Hospital Facility Dog Team

Megumi had long been interested in animal-assisted therapy/interventions and went to a specialized school for animals. After graduation, she worked as caregiver at a care facility before becoming a certified nurse and starting work in a hospital. Deeply moved by the TV documentary, "Bailey and Yui-chan" that she saw by chance, Megumi aspired to become a Facility Dog Handler.

Ty was bred at Career Dogs Australia (https://www.careerdogs.com.au/), which specializes in breeding a variety of service dogs. Ty was trained in Japan by a specialized dog trainer with experience working at organizations certified by Assistance Dogs International, the world's governing organization for the training and oversight of assistance dogs.

Origin of the name "Ty"

Ty was named after the founders' son Tyler, who was only two years old when he lost his battle with leukemia in Japan. Inspired by Tyler's courage and smiles, Ty's parents started a non-profit to make a difference in the lives children who fighting cancer and other serious illnesses and their family members in Japan.

Ty was trained along with another Facility Dog, "Masa", named after the late Dr. Masaaki Kumagai, who was Tyler's doctor. Masa is now working at the National Center for Child Health and Development^{*}.

2. Activities to date



Shine On! Kids and Shizuoka Children's Hospital introduced the first Hospital Facility Dog Program in Japan as a joint project in January 2010. Since taking over the program from Bailey (male, 12/14/2007 - 10/1/2020) in July 2012, Yogi (male, born 6/18/2011) has made over 27,000 visits with children, families and medical staff over the past 9 years.

Regular follow-ups of the Facility Dog teams are conducted by the dog trainers in accordance with international animal ethics guidelines. Shine On! Kids prepared for Yogi's retirement at the age of 10, in cooperation with veterinarians and the Shine On! Kids Facility Dog Program Advisory Board^{*}. Yogi's retirement date was determined based on the evaluation of his age and physical condition.

Shine On Kids was established in July 2006 and is now in its 15th year. Children facing treatment for childhood cancer and other serious illnesses face anxiety and great stress during their long hospitalization. Although the level of medical care in Japan is among the most advanced in the world, the founders felt there were still issues in terms of psychological support for patients and their families. Shine On! Kids' aims to create a complete pediatric patient support system in Japan - from the moment of diagnosis, throughout treatment and after discharge from hospital. Its core programs include: Beads of Courage in 24 hospitals, and Hospital Facility Dogs now in 4 hospitals.

Launched last year, Shine On! Connections offers interactive online content to children in 18 hospitals throughout Japan.
